

designs into wood surfaces. The word pyro gravure translates to "writing with fire."

Throughout his life, Luis has held diverse positions, which include working for the University of Puerto Rico until he retired. Years later, he picked up his creative passions and explored the unique skills involved in pyrography. Rediscovering his love and passion for ancestral arts, Luis began incorporating symbolic and cultural elements to connect spiritually with his viewers.

As an artist, Luis believes in the self-realization of being. He has a special connection with meditation, which he feels guides his creative process. In his art, he blends a distinct personal style with hints of eccentricity. The pieces pay homage to his ancestors and homeland traditions.

## Linda Gerrard

Linda Gerrard's previous career in project management and computer systems involved lots of structure, and then she turned to a form of art making that requires a lot of "letting go." She says "may the kiln gods be with me" is a common phrase glass artists utter upon opening the kiln.

Linda's luminous and colorful art glass – with its varying textures and layers - invites investigation. Inspired by nature, her travels, and her husband's photography, her glass making technique is often called "painting with frit," the calcined or partly fused materials of which glass

is made. Calcined means heated to a high temperature, but below the melting or

fusing point.

Her process can involve multiple fusings that may take 3 to 10 days for completion of a single piece. She creates visual depth by layering, as well as controlling the temperature and time in the kiln. She can achieve either a smooth or textured surface, or both.

Linda has taken many classes, participated in juried shows, made commissioned pieces, and continues to challenge

herself and her art. Her love of watercolor painting shows in her current work. She is also sponsorship director for Pacific Northwest Glass Guild.

## Arturo Villaseñor

Arturo Villaseñor was born in Mexico City in 1965 and is a multifaceted artist and educator. He graduated from National Polytechnic Institute with a bachelor's degree in physics and mathematics.

His passion was restoration, and he dedicated several years to preserving the architectural heritage of Mexico City, including such iconic buildings as the Postal Palace, Guarantees Building, East Portico of the Palace of Fine Arts,

and the Monument to the Mother. He worked alongside restoration specialists, painters, and skilled craftsmen.

In 2000, Arturo relocated to Oregon and began a career in adult education and social work. He collaborated closely with the Mexican Consulate and helped establish the first "Plaza Comunitaria" in Washington County, which provides edu-

cational resources and

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support to the Latino community. He also served as the coordinator of the Access Technology Program at Centro Cultural, where he taught others computer literacy and facilitated business training for Latino entrepreneurs.

Well known for his work with Centro and Adelante Mujeres, Arturo also nurtured his artistic pursuits as a poet, professional painter, graphic designer, sculptor, translator, writer, and photographer. In his artistic journey, Arturo is dedicated to sharpening his craft and exploring the diverse realms of artistic expression. His paintings reflect Mexican culture, 1950s American culture, the desert landscape, and more.

## Artists have great hearts

we donated the art, they said they could provide a tour, which just confirmed this was the right thing to do. The staff people said they have multiple locations in Portland and would most likely display the art in several places.

"I do a lot of art animal art," Teal continued. "That seemed like it would appeal to children, and it looked like it would be a good match for how the facility is decorated.

"This year I also donated to the Audubon Society and will plan to do that every year also. I'm not sure how much more art Ronald McDonald House would like. There were no requirements, but I think happy, serene, whimsical, childlike (themes) would fit the facilities best. On the tour we also learned they have a wish list for the facilities and toys for the children."

These communities are found in Ikaria, Greece; Okinawa, Japan; the Ogliastra Region of Sardinia, Italy; Loma Linda, California; and Nicoya Peninsula, Costa Rica and were brought to our attention by National Geographic Explorer and journalist, Dan Buetner in 2008. He researched these communities and found they share many common traits including healthy diet and an active lifestyle. And there is another thing they all share: a sense of belonging to a group and social network.

The Centenarian Project by Teenagers 2017-2023 is an ambitious and creative solution to bringing generations together using art as the connection. Portraits were made by 465 Australian teenagers who were paired with 465 centenarians from every state and territory in the country over this time period. One of

the exhibits, 100 Canberra, is a celebration of these transformational relationships and artworks. You can visit the virtual gallery – I hope


We also have opportunities to be a part of our

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
